

BFREE Overview:

The Belize Foundation for Research & Environmental Education (BFREE) is located in the foothills of the Maya Mountains on a 1153 acre biological field station in southern Belize. Founded in 1995, BFREE's primary goals are to assist the government of Belize in the conservation of Belize's protected areas and natural resources. This is achieved through facilitating scientific research, conducting environmental education programs and helping increase conservation awareness within the buffer communities nearest BFREE. Over the last twenty years more than 100 interns and long-term volunteers have stayed at our tropical research station in the middle of one of Central America's largest remaining tracts of intact rainforest. Not only have volunteers benefited from the unique experience of living and working in the tropical rainforest, but their creative contributions and hard work have helped tremendously with our wildlands conservation, sustainable living, and environmental research and education efforts.

Opportunities for Learning:

Nestled in the foothills of the Maya Mountains along the Bladen River, surrounded by more than a million acres of protected tropical rainforest, *BFREE* offers an extraordinary opportunity to learn how a non-profit research station runs in an area with spectacular wildlife and scenery. *BFREE* volunteer field assistants will be matched to a specific project depending on their interests and skills. Currently we are searching for volunteers to assist with projects in tropical agriculture, sustainable forestry, conservation of the Central American river turtle, and ornithological studies.

Applicants can apply for one of the three available Volunteer Field Assistant positions:

1) BFREE Avian Volunteer Field Assistant:

- Facilitate the development of hot spots for other resident and migrant birds around the BFREE reserve to describe diversity; including canopy species as observed from a 114 foot observation tower, along the Bladen River, and in comparison habitats of an agroforestry plot versus pristine forest
- Collect data to be submitted into eBirds and entered into an onsite database
- Develop the protocol for eBird data and monitoring program at BFREE
- Monitor a colony of Agami herons and Boat-billed Herons to determine nesting habits and successful hatchings, as well as mating and other social behaviors

2) BFREE Volunteer Field Assistant:

- Conduct a pre-approved personal research experiment for professional growth
- Support BFREE's Tropical Agriculture and Sustainable Forestry programs by working in the cacao and coffee agroforest and supporting harvest and fermentation processes of cacao
- Partake in the research and conservation of the critically endangered Central American River turtle known as the hicatee at the Hicatee Conservation & Research Center at the BFREE Field Station
- Perform avian data collection at various hot-spots around the BFREE Field Station

3) BFREE Hicatee Turtle Conservation & Research Volunteer Field Assistant:

- Assist in the daily feeding and care of the adult turtles and hatchlings and perform feeding trials
- Document growth on the hatchlings
- Clean and maintain tanks for hatchlings
- Assist in routine maintenance of the Hicatee Conservation and Research Center
- Collect observational data on the turtles

Requirements:

- Have a positive and flexible attitude, a desire to learn and work hard as well as the willingness to adapt to a changing work environment.
- Comfortable living in remote and rustic living conditions in a tropical environment and have a strong ability to get along with others in tight, close-knit, living conditions.
- Commitment to BFREE's mission and a passion for the environment and conservation
- BFREE Avian Volunteer Field Assistant must be proficient and active on eBird
- · Selected applicants must complete a physician signed health form of good health

Availability:

BFREE is seeking 5-6 motivated Volunteer Field Assistants for the Summer 2017 season. Availability for Volunteer Field Assistants range from May 1 - July 31, 2017. Start dates are flexible however, applicants must apply for a minimum of three weeks and a maximum of seven weeks.

Costs:

This is a complete volunteer position, Field Assistants will need to pay for their own travel costs to the BFREE Field Station and a project fee of \$350 per week (3 week minimum required). This project fee covers food and accommodations while at the BFREE Field Station. A large number of past students have received funding and/ or credit from their host institution to participate. Belizean rates available for local students
