Accommodation Protocols & Requirements

Thank you for your interest in visiting the BFREE Field Station and Privately Protected Area. BFREE is committed to ensuring your safety while visiting. We are happy to inform you that we have implemented all required measures to mitigate risks for our guests and staff as recommended by the Belize Tourism Board. Our staff have been trained to ensure your safety and are all fully vaccinated and boosted against COVID-19.

What to expect during your stay at BFREE?

- Support in booking Gold Standard transportation from the airport to BFREE.
- Enjoy eating in the BFREE dining room with a comfortable distance between yourself and other guests.
- Flexible bookings to accommodate payment reimbursements should you become symptomatic before arrival.
- Temperature checks for all guests upon arrival.
- Properly worn masks are required at all times, with exceptions
 - On a high-intensity tour such as hiking where the guide is 6 feet apart.
 - When actively eating or drinking while seated in the dining room
 - While swimming at the river once sufficient distance is maintained from others.

All guests must:

- Be fully vaccinated (two weeks after the second dose of a two-dose vaccine series or two weeks after a single-dose vaccine series). The vaccination requirement applies to anyone eligible to receive the vaccine, ages 5+ for US citizens and 12+ for Belizean citizens.
- Share proof of vaccine by emailing a photocopy of your vaccine card no later than 14-days before arrival.
- Review and sign BFREE's COVID-19 Liability and Assumption of Risk Waiver
- Ensure that your travel insurance covers medical care should you test positive in Belize. You will be required to cover all expenses associated with your care.
