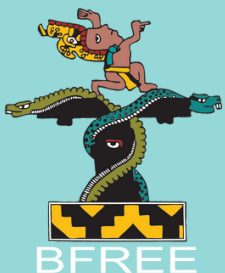

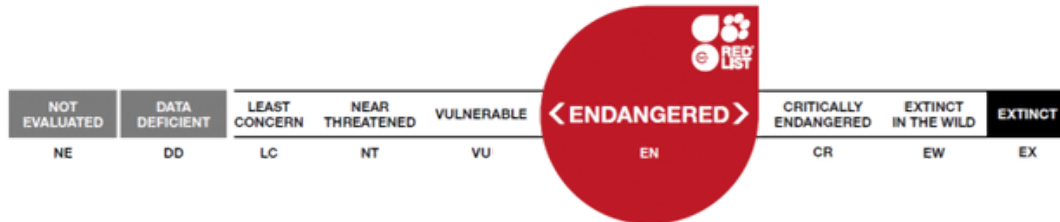

BIRD CONSERVATION STATUS KEY

In addition to the IUCN Red List conservation status for each bird species found at BFREE, we have included rankings from several other organizations to reflect the broader impact BFREE's reserve has on migratory birds. The first column after Population Trend is BCC (Birds of Conservation Concern), followed by VCWCS (Virginia's Comprehensive Wildlife Conservation Strategy), and finally, the Audubon Status for Atlantic and Mississippi flyways.

BIRDS OF CONSERVATION CONCERN (BCC):

The US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) 2021 BCC report relies heavily on the Avian Conservation Assessment Database (ACAD) and the Partners in Flight (PIF) network and identifies the bird species that represent their highest conservation priorities. The birds found on the BCC report and at BFREE are identified with an X in column #5 of our species list (pages 6-11).

VIRGINIA'S COMPREHENSIVE WILDLIFE CONSERVATION STRATEGY (VCWCS):

The birds identified by the VCWCS are listed in column #6 of our species list (pages 6-11).

Tier I: Critical Conservation Need. Faces an extremely high risk of extinction or extirpation.

Tier II: Very High Conservation Need. Has a high risk of extinction or extirpation.

Tier III: High Conservation Need. Extinction or extirpation is possible.

Tier IV: Moderate Conservation Need. The species may be rare in parts of its range, particularly on the periphery.

Conservation Ranking

A – Managers have identified “on the ground” species or habitat management strategies expected to benefit the species.

B – Managers have only identified research needs for the species, or managers have only identified “on the ground” conservation actions that cannot be implemented due to lack of personnel, funding, or other circumstance.

C – Managers have failed to identify “on the ground” actions or research needs that could benefit this species or its habitat, or all identified conservation opportunities for a species have been exhausted.
